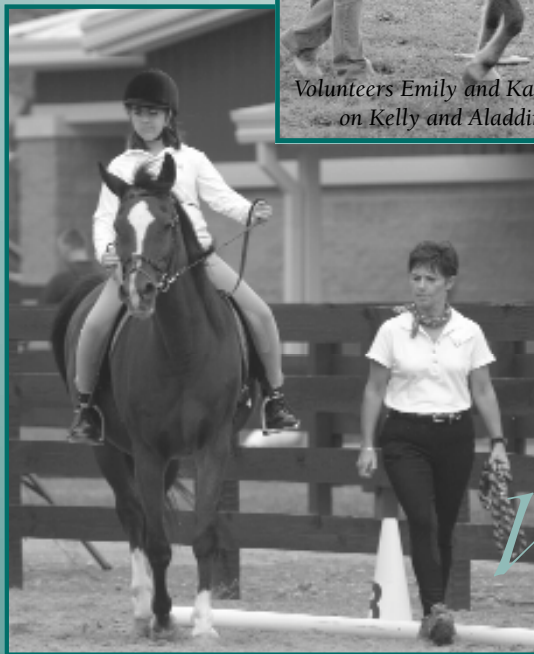

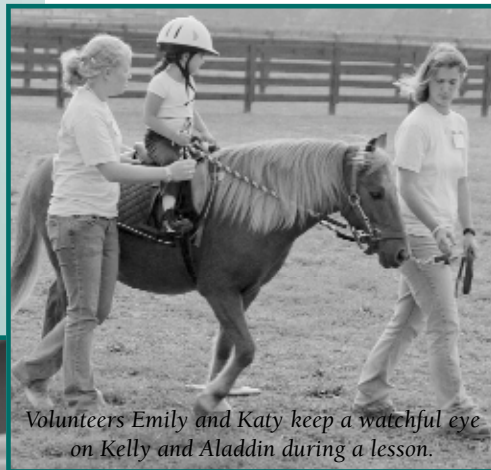

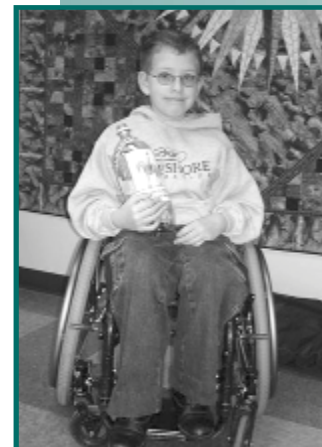

Meet the Saddle Up! Family

Where Were They Then

Back to the Future with Our Horse Heroes

Azuri is a 19 yr. old thoroughbred mare who joined Saddle Up! in June of 2002. She successfully played polo with owner, Orrin Ingram who graciously donated her to SU! to retire. Around her old home, Riverview Farm in Franklin, she was referred to as "Granma" because she was skilled and remained calm while training new polo players.

From the time she arrived she has been one of the best therapeutic horses in the Saddle Up! program. She is always quiet and patient with our riders, sometimes standing for up to 20 minutes at the mounting block waiting for them to feel confident enough to mount.

Azuri's other accomplishments since coming to SU! include: presenting the American flag for the past two years at our polo match fundraiser, Chukkers for Charity; carrying riders in our Ride-a-Thon fundraiser; rider demonstration at the 2004 Grand Prix fundraiser; many, many ribbons won with our riders in horse shows; and the first week of March she will be featured in a syndicated TV show called "Cafe Central TV" which airs in 47 different markets in the U.S! Family Ties

A Parent's Perspective with Tad and Ann



Our daughter, *Anna Claire*, is developmentally delayed with a seizure disorder. She has a serious language deficiency. As a matter of fact, we weren't sure if she would ever be able to say more than one word at a time. Even when she did try to speak, it was just parts of words.

One of the most significant days of my life was when I was walking in our neighborhood near Percy Warner Park, and I saw a lone horse in a pasture. I immediately ran home and got Anna Claire (at that time four years old). As we approached the fence, the horse was eating the grass in the pasture. Anna Claire burst into a huge smile, and said, "Horse eat!" When we arrived back home, my wife asked Anna Claire if she liked the horse, and she replied, "Eat grass!" That was the first time our daughter replied to a question.

So began Anna Claire's love affair with horses. Walking over to feed Dallas an apple or a carrot was a daily ritual. We struck up a friendship with the apartments' superintendent who owned Dallas. Dallas was so friendly and gentle with Anna Claire, and she would laugh and laugh when he snorted, or nuzzled her face with his nose.

Fast forward a couple of years, and Anna Claire was invited by her speech therapist to participate in a new program that she volunteered with called Saddle Up!. We drove out to a private farm on Highway 96, and when Anna Claire realized she was going to be able to actually ride a pony, it was like a dream come true. I thought she was going to get herself hurt; from the first lesson her favorite part of grooming was to clean the dirt out of the horse's hooves. If we didn't watch her carefully, she was liable to run up to any horse and start tugging on its leg!

Saddle Up! has truly been a blessing for Anna Claire. Back when riders could only do one session per year, she couldn't wait until the spring when hers began. When she is participating, her language skills improve, as does her ability to focus and listen. She has had several different instructors, and each one has been absolutely wonderful. They are constantly thinking of ways to challenge Anna Claire to work hard and improve her communication skills. The volunteers and instructors of Saddle Up! are some of the most caring and sensitive people we have ever had the good fortune to know.

Anna Claire will turn 15 this April, and she is a student at Hillsboro High School. We have to wake her every morning at 6:00 am to catch the school bus. It is usually very dark outside, and, like any teenager, Anna Claire hates leaving the warmth of her bed. Every morning can be a battle to get her up and out of bed. Except for Wednesdays. All we have to say is, "Anna Claire, today you ride your horse!", and she pops up with a big smile and a hug.
